The Village of Towanda Golf Cart & Utility Vehicle Ordinance <u>requires</u> registration. Reminder, <u>you MUST be 16</u> and over with a valid driver's license to operate a golf cart and utility vehicle.

Please email: <u>safety@villageoftowanda.org</u> to set-up your appointment.

You will need:

- golf cart/utility vehicle (needed for inspection)
- driver's license
- current insurance info
- required: front & rear lights, brake lights, turn signals, rearview mirror, slow moving vehicle emblem, and horn

Fees:

\$25 one-time application fee (not needed if you paid last year)

\$50 yearly permit fee per vehicle

DEDICATIONS

Blue Star Memorial Marker Dedicated in Towanda

A new Blue Star Memorial Highway sign was unveiled Saturday, Sept. 6, along the Route 66 corridor in Towanda to honor members of the U.S. Armed Forces.

The sign, located at Route 66 and N 1900 E Road, was made possible through a partnership between local groups and the National Garden Clubs, the project's primary funders. It bears the inscription: "A tribute to the Armed Forces who have defended the United States of America."

The drape was pulled by Larry Collins, a Towarda Marine Corps veteran of the Vietnam War, assisted by his daughter Nichole Collins and grandson Kasey Compton.

The half-hour dedication included remarks from Diane Greenawalt, president of Garden Clubs of Illinois (GCI) and board member of National Garden Clubs (NGC), and Ellen Culver, president of the Bloomington-Normal Garden Club. Funding for the marker came from the NGC's national program to establish veterans' markers along major U.S. highways.

Towarda representatives participating in the ceremony included Mayor Don Williams, Scott Flack, Village Trustee and Route 66 Board member; and Jim Schmidt of the Bloomington-Normal Garden Club.

The program, emceed by Jim Stahly of Normal, featured patriotic music from the Twin Cities Brass Quintet, which performed the national anthem, God Bless America, and Taps.

Land of Lincoln Honor Flight

John Lueschen and John Messer, both of Towanda, Illinois were among the 95 veterans participating in the Land of Lincoln Honor Flight out of Springfield on Tuesday, September 9th. The purpose of these flights is to provide a homecoming for veterans who may not have received proper welcomes when they returned from service. This trip is designed to "honor them and thank them for their service!"

Brett Lueschen served as guardian for his father John Lueschen, while Brian Lueschen served as guardian for his father-in-law, John Messer. Brett also served as a medic for the flight.

While in Washington, they visited the World War II, Korean and Vietnam War Memorials as well as Arlington National Cemetery, Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers, the Lincoln Memorial, the National Air & Space Museum, the US Marine Corps Memorial and the US Air Force Memorial. It is a full day for these honored Vets and their guardians.

There was an amazing crowd consisting of the public, family, friends, and previous participating Veterans donning their Honor Flight shirts from previous flights all packed the airport corridors. Hugs, tears, cameras, signs, flags, banners, and pictures were all on display to welcome back friends and loved ones. These 95 Veterans represented all branches of the military.
